Graduation Requirements: Successful Completion of a total of 25 credits, which include: 4 credits of English/language arts, 4 credits of math, 4 credits of science (with at least one year of lab study), 4 credits of social studies/history (including 1 credit of US History and government), 1 credit of fine arts, 1 credit of physical education, 1 credit of a foreign language, and a ½ credit in health.
